#### 1. BACKGROUND

In collaboration with the UNESCO Institute for Lifelong Learning (UIL) and the Institut de coopération pour l'éducation des adultes (ICÉA), the UNESCO Chair in Applied Research for Education in Prison is organizing a series of webinars in winter and autumn of 2021, focusing on research and innovative practices in prison education.

#### 2. OBJECTIVES OF THE WEBINAR

This webinar will provide a global overview of the possible impact and transformational potential of providing prison library services and reading-based activities to inmates. Having free access to relevant resources is crucial for prisoners' personal development, well-being and, ultimately, rehabilitation. Regional examples will underline and highlight experiences on the ground. The objectives of this webinar will be to showcase the ways in which prison libraries and literacy services provided by community organizations can play an important role in furthering prisoners' education, and on minimizing the negative impact of incarceration on families.

Through presentations from countries around the world, participants will have the opportunity to engage with representatives of prison library services actively working to better the learning conditions of inmates. They will also learn how the current health crisis may have impacted their programmes, and what solutions have been implemented to date.
