SUMMARY OF THE WEBINAR

This round table will present an overview of Latin American juveniles' experiences in prison from the perspective of education as a "social good". Its implementation seems urgent to us since it offers possibilities of reintegration in contexts of great social fragility. In addition, we will focus on the recovery of educational experiences that are problematic in the daily environment, to give meaning to the learning of the incarcerated.

The criminalization of lower-class youths and its stigmatization in public opinion and in the media have led to a tightening of social demands of this public opinion. The call for imprisonment rests on a vision of young people as criminals, lack of knowledge of the socio-economic and family contexts in which they grew up and which have shaped their identity, even going so far as to blur their humanity.

We propose to approach the living conditions in detention from a cross-sectoral perspective. This will allow us to focus on the impact of education in prison, on youth experiences with regard to the right to education in prison and on education as a condition that gives meaning to punitive imprisonment. We will then be able to explore the paths of young people and their ability to reflect and perhaps embrace a different way of living in the prison environment or to open up new avenues for their life after prison.
